



Weekly Adoptions July 19-25, 2010

Almost as many dogs reclaimed as total adoptions, but it all means one thing – animals found homes!

Totals: **3 cats** adopted; **5 dogs** adopted; and 7 animals reclaimed!

Cats: **Cassandra**, who had been hanging out at Paws on the Sand in Lincoln City was adopted. Sweet, shy **Precious** (above right) our 5-year old cuddler, went out on a sleepover to a home with other cats, and everyone got along just fine. **Sylvia**, a little kitten that was being fostered by the Humane Society, was adopted by a family that saw her in Yachats over the July 4th holiday.

Dogs: **Matilda**, one of our many Chihuahuas, was adopted by a couple who saw her in the office and immediately fell in love with her. No doubt she is already spoiled! **Fannie**, our Australian Shepherd mix, was adopted by a woman with herding dog experience, and Fannie will now be part of her owner's 'walking group' with neighbors and their dogs. Lucky girl! **Missy** (now Reina – above left) is the first of the four pit bulls we transferred in from Multnomah County to be adopted. She now gets to go to work with her new owners and will be spending part of her time in the Portland area. Life is good, and the Second Chance program works! **Jamie**, the little long-haired Chihuahua whose elderly owner died, found his new home through the matchmaking efforts of one of our volunteers. After less than a week in the Shelter, Jamie now lives with a woman whose little dog recently died, and the minute he got to his new home he came out of his shell and everyone is happy. And finally **Stewie**, our dachshund/Jack Russell Terrier mix, was adopted by a woman in Albany who had a dog almost identical to Stewie, so she knows the breed well.

Transfers: None this week.

Redemptions: One cat (a rare occurrence) and six dogs were reunited with their owners: an orange tabby, an American bulldog, 2 Labs, a Golden Retriever, a Cocker Spaniel, and an Australian Shepherd.

Thanks to our adopting families, and to the entire team at the Shelter (staff and volunteers) who work so hard socializing these animals to help them find their *forever* homes.
